About Us

Inside Out Youth Services (IOYS) is the primary LGBTQ+ nonprofit community serving LGBTQ+ youth (ages 13-22) in El Paso County. We provide a safe space for gender and sexuality diverse youth and young adults to grow their identities, learn leadership skills and develop the tools needed to both thrive personally and to act as agents of change in their communities. We also provide outreach education throughout the region to create a supportive climate for LGBTQ+ youth.

IOYS accomplishes these goals through our weekly programming, targeted leadership development opportunities, community partnerships, and through educational outreach to local school systems, healthcare agencies, and other groups providing education and care to LGBTQ+ youth and young adults.

Job Description

Seeking a part-time (20 hours per week) clinician. The clinician's role is to build the emotional resilience of LGBTQ+ youth (ages 13-22) by providing individual therapy, understanding their unique clinical needs, assessing and responding to behavioral emergencies, and by serving as a consultant to IOYS staff on matters impacting youth mental health and by supporting IOYS youth involved with other government agencies.

This position is grant funded for two years. There is no guarantee of employment after the grant period has expired.

Essential Job Duties

Requires strong organizational and communication skills, working knowledge of personal computer, ability to maintain confidentiality. Able to complete required paperwork according to established protocol and regulatory agency requirements. Must be able to maintain professional and appropriate boundaries with youth, and families, following the established guidelines and ethics codes of the profession for which the clinician is licensed. Ability to act professionally in high stress situations. Must hold an active, Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT). License in the state of Colorado.
